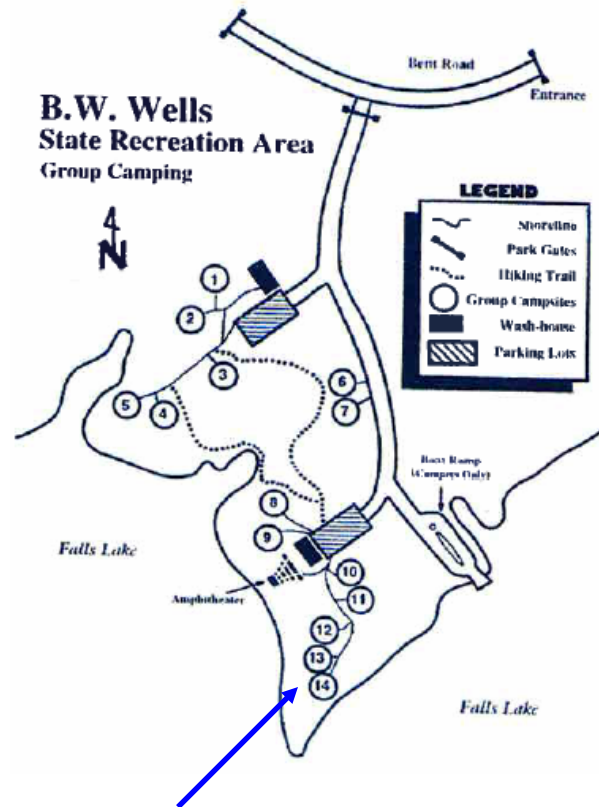
### REGISTRATION CHECKLIST

Directions to the camp:

- North on Creedmoor road (Hwy 50) to Highway 98
- East on Highway 98 towards Wake Forest for 5-7 miles
- Left on Stony Hill road. A gas station is on the right. Follow brown "B.W. Wells" signs.
- Left on Bud Morris Road
- Left on Bent Road to the park.
- Pack 352 has sites 12, 13, and 14 reserved.
- Please keep in mind that the campsites are an approx. ¼ mile walk from the parking lot.

## WELCOME

The Webelos campout 2007 is an important event for the Pack 352 Webelos scout. It's a great opportunity to get outside, camp, play games, and have fun!!

The first year Webelos will be able to earn four activity badges which will go toward the Webelos rank award and Arrow of Light.

The second year Webelos will engage in a few extra activities geared towards their upcoming entrance into Boy Scouts.

Each Webelos scout should be accompanied by at least one parent.\* We seriously suggest the parent dedicate Friday afternoon to the preparing for and traveling to the campout, since the park gates close and lock at 6 PM, and there is no way to gain entrance after 6 PM.

Be aware that there is an approximate ¼ mile walk from the parking lot to the campsites.

## SETTING UP CAMP

Make sure your Scout helps to set up camp when you arrive!

In just over a year, your son may be heading out on a camping trip with a Boy Scout Troop where he will be expected to handle his own equipment and put up his own tent. Do what you can now to help him learn those skills!

\* If a parent cannot attend, rare exceptions are allowed as long as the scout has another parent in responsible charge for them. Keep in mind that scouts are NEVER allowed to share a tent with any adult except their own parent(s).

## PACKING

### THINGS NOT TO BRING

- Straight bladed knives of any kind
- Pocketknives for cub scouts
- Electronics: toys, cd players, ipods, TVs, radios, handheld games, etc.
- Trading cards such as yugi-oh, pokemon
- Pets
- Siblings

### Personal Checklist

Let your Cub Scout pack his own bag, but go over a checklist of things he should bring.

1. Toothbrush/paste, soap, shampoo, towel
2. Medicine, bug spray, sunscreen
3. Sleeping bag (a warm one!), pillow
4. Clothing: socks, underwear, hat, Class B t-shirts, hat, shoes (no open-toed shoes), warm layers, raingear (if you forget raingear, it will rain!)
5. SAFETY: Flashlight, Personal emergency whistle
6. MESS kit, and cup suitable for hot chocolate

### Camping Checklist

Involve your son in the "generic" camping packing. Pack 352 does not have tents. You will have to bring your own.

1. Tent, ground cloth lantern, chairs, cooler, roasting sticks
2. Your favorite snacks & drinks for the weekend.

## CAMPFIRES

We will have campfires both nights (as long as there is no fire ban in effect!). Friday will be casual with shared snacks, conversation, and stories. Saturday will be a formal scout campfire program and **each den must have an "action song" prepared.**

## MENU

All Webelos will participate in group meals – this fulfills part of the Outdoorsman Activity Badge for the first year Webelos, and gives the second year Webelos more practice! Each den is responsible for providing a meal for everyone at the campout. Make sure to be in touch with your den's meal coordinator, as planning, shopping, and then preparation, serving, and clean-up of the meal will be the responsibility of the whole den, and the boys should do as much of the work as possible. (Please talk with your den's meal coordinator about all of this!)
