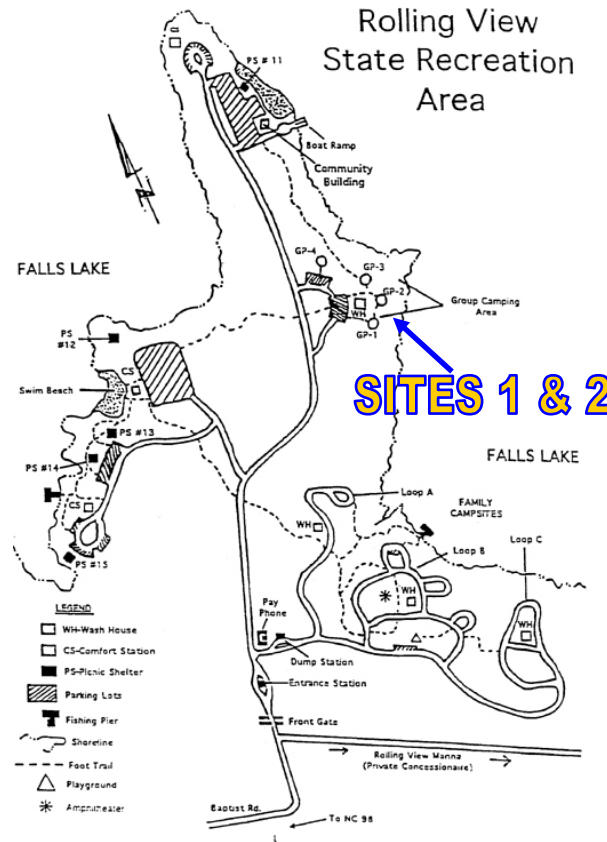
REGISTRATION CHECKLIST

Please return the following to your DEN LEADER by August 21, 2008:

1. Completed registration form (above)
2. Check made payable to Pack 352.
3. Updated class 1 Medical Form must be on file with the pack! Check with your den leader if you're not sure.
4. Informed Consent Agreement must be on file with the pack! Check with your den leader if you're not sure.

Directions to the camp:

- North on Creedmoor Rd (Hwy 50) to Hwy 98
- West on Hwy 98 towards Durham (~5.5 mi.)
- Right on Baptist Rd to park gate (~4.5 mi.)
- Tell the ranger at the gate you are with Pack 352 (you should get a parking tag at no charge)
- Continue straight after the gate, following signs for the group camp sites
- Pack 352 has group sites 1 & 2 reserved (see map below)



WELCOME

The Webelos campout 2008 is an important event for the Pack 352 Webelos scout. It's a great opportunity to get outside, camp, play games, and have fun!!

The first year Webelos will be able to work on several outdoor-related activity badges. They will not complete all requirements for these badges at the campout, but should make significant progress.

The second year Webelos will engage in a few extra activities geared towards earning the Arrow of Light and their upcoming entrance into Boy Scouts.

Each Webelos scout must be accompanied by a parent.* Due to capacity constraints, only one parent should attend per scout, unless both parents are campout activity leaders or den leaders.

Park gates close and lock at 8 PM, and there is no way to gain entrance after this time. If you are planning to camp Friday night, it is important that you arrive before then.

Be aware that there is a short walk from the parking lot to the campsites.

SETTING UP CAMP

Each scout should present himself with his gear to his den leader and help set up his own tent. These are Webelos requirements and necessary for preparing for Boy Scouts, where he will be expected to handle his own equipment and put up his own tent. Do what you can now to help him learn those skills!

* If a parent cannot attend, rare exceptions are allowed as long as the scout has another parent in responsible charge for them. Keep in mind that scouts are NEVER allowed to share a tent with any adults except their own parents.

PACKING

THINGS NOT TO BRING

- Straight bladed knives of any kind
- Electronics: toys, cd players, ipods, TVs, radios, handheld games, etc.
- Trading cards such as yu-gi-oh, pokemon
- Pets
- Siblings (exception: Boy Scouts who are signed up to volunteer at the campout)
- Swim suits – NO SWIMMING (scout rules)

Personal Checklist

Let your Cub Scout pack his own bag, but go over a checklist of things he should bring.

1. Medicine, toiletries (toothbrush/paste, soap, shampoo, towel, etc.)
2. Sleeping bag, pillow
3. Clothing: Class A uniform (for travel to/from campout & meals), Class B T-shirts, hat, closed-toe shoes, socks, underwear, warm layers, raingear (if you forget raingear, it will rain!)
4. SAFETY: flashlight, personal emergency whistle
5. MESS kit, and cup suitable for hot chocolate

Camping Checklist

Involve your son in the "generic" campout packing. Pack 352 does not have tents to loan out.

1. Tent, ground cloth, lantern, chairs, cooler, roasting sticks, bug spray, sunscreen
2. Your favorite snacks & drinks for the weekend.

POCKET KNIVES

A scout must have his **Whittling Chip card** with him at any time that he is in possession of a pocket knife and must obey all **Whittling Chip safety rules**.

CAMPFIRES

We will have campfires both nights (as long as there is no fire ban in effect). Friday will be casual with shared snacks, conversation, and stories. Saturday will be a formal scout campfire program and each den must have an "action song" prepared.

MENU

All Webelos will participate in group meals. This is a Webelos requirement and great practice for future camping! Each den is responsible for providing a meal for everyone at the campout. Make sure to be in touch with your den's meal coordinator, as planning, preparation, serving, and clean-up of the meal will be the responsibility of the whole den, and the boys should do as much of the work as possible. (Please talk with your den's meal coordinator about all of this!)

Friday

Dinner: A campfire will be provided for cooking. Bring your own dinner or make arrangements with your den for a group meal.

Saturday

Breakfast provided by Den #9
Lunch provided by Dens #12 & 13
Dinner provided by Den # 8

Sunday

Continental breakfast provided by Den # 10

Mess Kits

In order to exercise conservation of our forest resources, ALL Webelos ARE REQUIRED TO BRING A MESS KIT to use during all meals, and a cup suitable for hot chocolate. You can purchase such items at the Scout store, Dick's Sporting Goods, Walmart, etc. The mess kit should include an eating surface and basic utensils. Scouts will be washing their mess kits after all meals.

Dietary Restrictions

Please inform your den leader of any dietary restrictions or allergies so that we can attempt to accommodate all scouts. Parents are expected to provide suitable food for picky eaters. Fruit and water will be available throughout the weekend.
